



## School Health Programme

School of Nursing Science and Research organized a School Health Programme in Gov. Primary School at Ghanghola Village, Dankaur, Greater Noida, RHTC Panchayat on 22nd and 23rd February 2017. The programme was organized by final year students of B.Sc Nursing with the guidance of Community Health Nursing department. Objectives of the programme was to promote the positive health among school children, to create awareness regarding prevention of various diseases, early diagnosis, treatment and follow up of defects and to promote healthful school environment.

On 22/02/17, the final year B.Sc Nursing students conducted physical examination and BMI calculation of the students, facilitated medical intervention from Sharda hospital by referring for those shortlisted through the screening, imparted awareness on health issues, adolescent health, hand-washing, ill effects of tobacco and tooth brushing techniques to students. On 23/02/2017 students have conducted various health educations by demonstrating on oral hygiene, hand washing, role-play on worm infestation, health education on good and bad touch and model presentation of vitamin A and protein rich diet.

The students also organized entertainment programme for school children like dancing and quiz sessions, and presented rewards for students who have answered them correctly. The programme was winded up by distributing notebooks, pencils and chocolates as a token of love for the children for their active participation.

## Understanding the Living Machines: Seminar and Workshop

With a view to develop in-depth knowledge about Anatomy and Physiology among first years of GNM and B.Sc Nursing students, School of Nursing Science and Research, Sharda University, organized a crossover learning method, i.e., seminar and workshop in Anatomy and Physiology, 'Understanding the Living Machines' from March 7 to 10, 2017. Venue for seminar was Auditorium 014, Sharda University, and workshop was conducted in Anatomy Museum, SMSR, Sharda University. Organizers of the programme were Prof. Pauline Sharmila (Principal, SNSR), Mr. Dani Philip (Asso. Professor), Mr. Vedamurthy (Asst. Professor) and Ms. Rekha Kumari (Asst. Professor).

On 7th March 2017, the programme was commenced with a welcome speech by Ms. Anshu Mishra, IV year B.Sc Nursing student. Dr. P.L.Kariholu, Dean, SMS&R shared his words of encouragement to the organizers and presenters. Dr. Nirupma Gupta, HOD (Anatomy), SMS&R spoke on the importance of Anatomy and Physiology as a subject in medical profession and Dr. Manisha Jindal, Asso. Dean, HOD (Physiology), SMS&R emphasized the need of understanding the living machines, i.e., various organs and systems in human body. She also unfolded the theme for chart competition, which was held on 10.03.2017, which was 'Heart, Brain and Eye'. Prof. Pauline Sharmila, Principal, SNSR also encouraged the presenters and participants for their active involvement and for having hands-on training in Anatomy and Physiology.

Eventually, there was a session of pre-test to assess the knowledge about Anatomy and Physiology. Knowledge level of 153 students was assessed.

Seminars were conducted in the morning session (10.00 am - 1.00 pm) and workshop in the evening (2.00 - 4.00 pm). It included nervous system, sensory/ integumentary system, circulatory system, respiratory system, digestive system, skeletal system, urinary system and reproductive system. Presenters were, selected students of III & IV year B.Sc Nursing and GNM III & Internship students, SNSR. Target group included the entire students of first year B.Sc nursing and GNM students.

On the final day, after the seminar, at 11.00 am, a post-test was done for the same participants, who were 153 in number. Feedback was obtained from the presenters regarding the seminar and workshop.

As the part of chart competition, display of charts on the theme heart, eye and brain was held at 11.00 am which was later evaluated by the judges. Venue for display was near dissection hall, Anatomy department, SMSR. The judges invited were Dr. Manisha Jindal, (Asso. Dean, Anatomy department, SMSR), Dr. Nirupma Gupta, (HOD, Anatomy department, SMSR) and Prof. Pauline Sharmila, (Principal, SNSR).

At 2.00 pm, there held a valedictory session of the seminar and workshop, during which, there was a student participant's feedback session and prize distribution. Student's feedback was found to be extremely good on the seminar and workshop. There was an announcement about the effectiveness of the seminar and workshop by comparison of pre-test and post-test scores. Knowledge enhancement was found to be of 25.95 % more when compared to pre test knowledge scores. Hence it is concluded that the students knowledge has improved by this seminar and workshop held between 7<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

## Continuing Nursing Education for Staff Nurses

Continuing Nursing Education programme is conducted regularly for the staff nurses of Sharda Hospital as a part of enhancement of updated knowledge and skills. This is conducted on a weekly basis, by the faculties of School of Nursing on various topics, which are highly recommended for incorporating in the nursing care.

Some of the recent topics dealt are: oxygen administration, steam inhalation, blood transfusion, pre-operative care, post-operative care, surgical asepsis, suctioning, Total parenteral nutrition, hematological investigations etc. Nurse's role and special considerations during the procedures are specially emphasized.

Pre-test and post-test are also conducted, in which the mean knowledge enhancement score was found to be highly significant in all the above sessions. Even, the feedbacks of the staff nurses are found to be highly satisfactory. Hence it is found that the CNE's organized by SNSR is beneficial in enhancing the knowledge about the recent updates in Nursing.
